Due to the heavy losses in the production and distribution of the rally book last year certain changes have had to be made. The committee apologises if this causes any inconvenience, but certain aspects had to change. I will say at this point we are one of the few centres that still

produce a hard copy of the rally programme and we are under pressure from Head Office to go totally digital with the rally programme, but the committee feel that a hard copy is preferable to the majority of East Yorkshire members. The brochures should be available for distribution from the New Year rally onwards from any committee member. If you are attending this rally, you can collect yours, if not and a friend is attending, they can also collect your brochure for you providing they have your membership member. We have also arranged a brochure collection day at Woodmansey Village Hall on the 27th. January from 11 o'clock onwards. The Barn Dance is at the same venue on the same evening.

What hasn't changed is that we are running lots of different rallies for your enjoyment and remember that from December 1st the rally brochure will be on our website and rallies can be booked from that date.






It's nice for the marshals to see their rally in pictures, it sometimes encourages more ralliers to book next year.
